This spring festival is a firm favourite in the Sybil Elgar Calendar. We all celebrate the coming of Spring; the longer days, the colour the new life.


For us it is an explosion of creativity, a celebration of change and an opportunity to burst some of the myths about our wonderful autistic young people.
