## Multisensory learning

**Multisensory** learning involves more than one sense at time during learning tasks. By using sight, hearing, movement, and touch in learning tasks it gives children and young people more than one way to connect with what they are **learning**.

## Multisensory Learning Tasks to do at home

### Sand or Shaving Cream Writing

This task incorporates:

- Sight
- Touch
- Sound

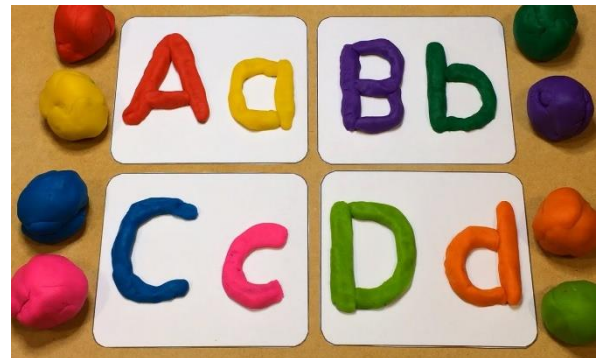


1. Start with a small amount of shaving foam or sand on a tray.
2. Spread the sand or shaving foam out and allow the Child to write a letter or word in it.
3. As they write the letters out encourage them to say the sound before blending the letters together to say the word.

### Play dough letters formation

This task incorporates:

- Sight
- Smell
- Touch
- Sound



1. Start by rolling play dough into small balls
2. Allow the child to use the play dough to make letter and words
3. You may want to give them a visual reference to help them with this task

*Please make sure to provide adult supervision at all times when your child is engaged in these activities and lock away resources when not in use, for your child's safety*
